The pandemic: Cancer Can't Wait

While the Canadian Cancer Survivor Network continued to organize its regular activities and start new ones in 2022, its main concern was to identify the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on cancer patients, caregivers, and survivors. Between 2020 and 2022, CCSN commissioned Leger to conduct four surveys of Canadian cancer patients, caregivers, and those in the process of being diagnosed to identify the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on their lives and their access to cancer care. CCSN's report of the findings of the first three surveys, Thrown Under the Bus! Disruption of cancer care in Canada during the COVID-19 pandemic, and the report of the fourth survey, which asked patients and caregivers about their concerns about society opening and dropping COVID-19 restrictions, For Cancer Patients and Caregivers, the Pandemic is Not Over. CCSN will continue this work in 2023 and has already commissioned Leger to conduct a fifth survey on the impact of long COVID in cancer patients and caregivers.

Right2Survive Lung Cancer Screening Initiative

CCSN is the lead partner in the Right2Survive Lung Cancer Screening Initiative, with the Lung Health Foundation and Lung Cancer Canada as partners. The project website is www.right2survive.ca, with over 2,400 on a mailing list and four newsletters a year. This program's first objective was to speed up new treatments for lung cancer, and in 2022, added lung cancer screening as a priority. Lung cancer screening can help find lung cancer early, when treatment has a better chance of working. Low-dose computed tomography (CT) scans search the lung cancer as well as other lung diseases. Early detection using low-dose CT scanning has been shown to reduce lung cancer deaths by 20 per cent. CCSN is in the process of creating a new aggregate prostate cancer website. Work completed in 2022 included the creation of a Steering Committee composed of prostate cancer patients, caregivers, and healthcare researchers and clinicians to oversee the project and the creation of a site map.





Four surveys, one message: CANCER CAN'T WAIT

The Canadian Cancer Survivor Network has published four surveys of patients, caregivers and pre-diagnosis patients in Canada. Across the board, it has shown that the COVID-19 pandemic has had a great impact on these groups, and has tracked their responses from the early days of the pandemic, to the vaccine rollout, to the lifting of public health restrictions.

These surveys have formed the basis for our Cancer Can't Wait campaign, bringing the concerns of cancer patients and caregivers to provincial parliaments.

CCSN held the All-party Cancer Caucus on October 26th to discuss pressing concerns about cancer care with Ontario MPPs. The Caucus meeting's purpose was twofold: to urge policy makers to increase accessibility to lung cancer screening, and to convey the concerns among cancer patients that they are being put at risk by the easing of COVID-19 public health measures.

During 2022, CCSN met virtually with over 50 elected politicians and staff in nearly every province across the country. Topics discussed at these meetings were lung cancer screening and the impact of COVID-19 restrictions being lifted on cancer patients and caregivers.

Election

The Canadian Cancer Survivor Network engages patients, caregivers & families in election campaigns whenever a federal, provincial or territorial election is called.

CCSN works with patients and survivors to frame questions about cancer care and healthcare issues nationally or in their province or territory. Once questions are prepared, CCSN sends them to all political parties and to all candidates for these parties. Responses are posted on our website and disseminated through our blog and social media.

In 2022, we sent questions to candidates standing in the Ontario and Quebec provincial elections. These questions revolved around COVID-19's suspension of cancer care, expanding access to lung cancer screening, and lowering the age for self referal for mammograms.

Patient Input Submissions & Surveys

CCSN regularly works with patients and caregivers to collect input for various reports and submissions. This includes submissions for drugs under review through the Canadian Agency for Drugs and Technologies in Health (CADTH) and the Institut national d'excellence en santé et en services sociaux (INESSS), as well as internal CCSN reports which assist us in defining key asks to bring to decision-makers.

The process typically includes developing an online survey for patients and caregivers to provide feedback on which symptoms and side effects are most important to them, expectations or experiences with various treatments, as well as emotional and financial issues if present.

Receiving direct input from patients, caregivers and survivors is extremely valuable.

CCSN is proud to help provide a bridge to health technology assessment (HTA) & policymakers.

CCSN was a charter member and is very active in the **International Liver Cancer Movement** (ILCM), created two years ago. CCSN is on the Steering Group, and CCSN's President & CEO was Interim Chair since summer 2022 and has been re-elected to the Steering Group in November 2022 elections.

CCSN was a charter member of **Cancer Action Now Alliance**, a national alliance of patient organizations, professional associations, and life sciences companies who are witnessing the magnitude of the problem our cancer care system and its patients are facing in light of the pandemic. CANA has come together to call on governments to address the issues in our cancer care systems so that Canadians with cancer have a chance to live longer, better lives than anywhere else in the world. CCSN is also a member of the Steering Committee and the 2023 Planning Committee.

CCSN's research on **disease-free survival meaningful end point for lung cancer patients**, undertaken in collaboration with Broadstreet Health Economics & Outcomes Research in Vancouver, was accepted as a poster presentation at the European Respiratory Society Virtual Conference in September 2021 at the Canadian Association for Population Therapeutics (CAPT) 2021 Virtual Conference in October 2021, and as a workshop topic given at the CADTH November 2021.

CCSN has joined with many patient groups to prevent changes to **the Patent Medicines Prices Review Board** that may cause fewer new treatments to be approved in Canada as well as reduced R&D funding and clinical trials. On October 6, 2022, CCSN held a webinar entitled What's Next for the Patent Medicine Prices Review Board, given by Nigel Rawson.

CCSN also works actively on the following files: tumour-agnostic treatments and next generation sequencing (NGS); national pharmacare; budget submissions; real world evidence; legislative monitoring. CCSN is also a patient group partner in several ongoing research projects and applications for research funding.

CCSN is a member of the following coalitions and organizations: Best Medicines Coalition; Beat Cancer Coalition; Alberta Health Network; MedAccessBC; CanRehab; CanCertainty; Coalition priorité cancer au Québec; BioCanRx Patient Stakeholder Alliance; and other ad hoc committees established to collaborate on issues as they arise.
